2. RESOLUTION SEEKING FUNDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A PFC JOSEPH DWYER PEER-TO-PEER SUPPORT PROGRAM IN LIVINGSTON COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Livingston County Office of Mental Health is seeking to establish a PFC Joseph Dwyer Peer-to-Peer Support Program to serve all of Livingston County; and

WHEREAS, named to honor the memory of an Iraq combat medic from Mount Sinai, New York that returned from war with Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and a brain injury, the Dwyer Program is a non-clinical program that provides a secure, comfortable setting for Vet-to-Vet support among veterans who personally understand the effects of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI); and

WHEREAS, the free and confidential program is available to all veterans, members of the Armed Forces, Guard and Reserves regardless of service dates, discharge status or dependency status; and

WHEREAS, the PFC Joseph Dwyer Peer-to-Peer Program is funded and administered through the New York State Office of Mental Health and managed locally by the county office of mental health; and

WHEREAS, the Livingston County Board of Supervisors recognizes the honorable services and sacrifices of Livingston County veterans and their families; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this Board of Supervisors hereby requests PFC Joseph Dwyer Peer-to-Peer Program funding be placed in the New York State budget and provided to Livingston County; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this Board of Supervisors shall forward this resolution to Senator George Borrello, Senator Patrick Gallivan, Assemblywoman Marjorie Byrnes, and all others deemed necessary and appropriate.

3. RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE NEW YORK STATE COUNTY VETERANS SERVICE OFFICERS ASSOCIATION'S BUDGET REQUEST TO INCREASE ANNUAL FUNDING TO COUNTY VETERAN SERVICES AGENCIES IN NEW YORK STATE

WHEREAS, New York State Executive Law Section 359 indicates the New York State Director of Veterans' Services, with the approval of the Veterans' Services Commission, shall provide funding to county veterans' service agencies not to exceed \$10,000 per year; and

WHEREAS, Executive Law Section 357(3) requires all county veteran service agency directors to receive proper training and maintain accreditation; and

WHEREAS, over the last decade the value of \$10,000 has dramatically decreased due to the increasing expenses related to the basic upkeep and operations of county veteran service agencies. This limited funding fails to cover the costs associated with hiring a full-time/part-time veteran service officer, expense of acquiring sustainable technological solutions, transportation expenses to reach veterans and their family members in rural counties, and the cost of statutorily mandated accreditation and training; and

WHEREAS, from 1961 to 2009 State reimbursement under Executive Law Section 359 remained static at \$5,000; and

WHEREAS, in 2009 the value of the \$5,000 State reimbursement was far lower than in 1961 when the law was created and the original intentions of the State Legislators who drafted the law were no longer being met. This resulted in the reimbursement cap being increased to \$10,000 per year; and

WHEREAS, the Livingston County Veteran Service Agency only received an annual amount of \$8,520

in State funding over the 9-year time span from 2009 to 2018 ignoring the Executive Law mandate of \$10,000, thereby shorting the County \$13,320; and

WHEREAS, in 2019 the State finally followed the mandates of Executive Law Section 359 and provided Livingston County Veteran Service Agency with the full annual funding amount of \$10,000; and

WHEREAS, the Livingston County Director of Veteran Services, Jason Skinner, has requested the New York State Budget Director to increase the State's share of county veterans service agency operation and maintenance costs to one half of one percent of benefits realized on behalf of each County's Veteran claimants; now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, the State's share of Livingston County Veteran Services Agency operation and maintenance costs should be \$70,000 for fiscal year 2022; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Livingston County Board of Supervisors hereby requests an increase in annual State funding to all county veteran service agencies from \$10,000 to one half of one percent of benefits realized in each county in order to appropriately compensate the efforts of its County Service Officers; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this Board of Supervisors shall forward this resolution to Senator George Borrello, Senator Patrick Gallivan, Assemblywoman Marjorie Byrnes, and all others deemed necessary and appropriate.

4. PROCLAIMING FEBRUARY 3, 2022 AS FOUR CHAPLAINS' DAY IN LIVINGSTON COUNTY

WHEREAS, February 3, 2022, marks the 76th Anniversary of the tragic torpedoing of the U.S.A.T. Dorchester, a United States Army transport ship, 150 miles off the coast of Greenland that resulted in the loss of 672 lives; and

WHEREAS, witnesses of the event recount in the Congressional Record the heroism and self-sacrifice of four chaplains of different faiths: Lt. George L. Fox, Methodist; Lt. Alexander D. Goode, Jewish; Lt. John P. Washington, Catholic; and Lt. Clark V. Poling, Dutch Reformed Witnesses recalled that while the ship sank, these four chaplains went from soldier to soldier calming fears, handing out lifejackets, and guiding men to safety. When there were no more lifejackets to give, they removed their own and gave them to others. The chaplains were last seen arm-in-arm in prayer on the ship's deck; and

WHEREAS, many of the 230 men that survived this tragedy owe their lives to these four chaplains, who with their unique interfaith spirit and love for their fellow man were memorialized by the United States Postal Service on a popular 1948 postage stamp entitled: "These Immortal Chaplains – Interfaith in Action;" and

WHEREAS, Congress passed a Concurrent Resolution in 1957 honoring these four chaplains and the men who died with them. Presidents Truman and Eisenhower issued similar proclamations calling for national recognition and participation in memorial services throughout the land, to be observed annually by the American Legion and others on the first Sunday in February; and

WHEREAS, Congress created a special Medal for Heroism in 1960, in memory of these four chaplains, an action which has never been repeated since January 27, 1998, and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed a unanimous resolution designating February 3 as "Four Chaplains' Day" and, as it has done for decades, the first Sunday in February is recognized nationally by many congregations and by the American Legion as "Four Chaplains Sunday"; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Livingston County Board of Supervisors hereby proclaims February 3, 2022 as "Four Chaplains Day" in Livingston County.

If not eligible, the Undersheriff shall receive retirement benefits as set forth in the Agreement between the County of Livingston and the Civil Service Employees Association Full-Time Unit.
- 2. **Jury Duty Leave**. Paid jury duty leave shall be provided to full-time Department Heads as set forth in the Agreement between the County of Livingston and the Civil Service Employees Association Full-Time Unit.
- 3. Vacation.

a. Department Heads other than those listed in subsection "b" below will be provided with vacation as provided in this subsection.

Such Department Heads will accrue vacation in accordance with the following table:

Anniversary of Date of Hire	Vacation Accruals

A maximum of three (3) working days' vacation may be held over from one anniversary year to the next. These days will not accumulate from year to year, but may be used in the new anniversary year.

Department Heads may receive payment in lieu of vacation on the same basis as provided to those employees covered by the collective bargaining agreement between Livingston County and the Civil Service Employees Association Full-Time Unit.

- b. The following Department Heads employed at the Department of Health will accrue vacation on the same basis as provided under the collective bargaining agreement between Livingston County and the New York State Nurses Association: the Directors of Patient Services, and the WIC Program Coordinator. These department heads shall only be entitled to vacation carryover or payment in lieu of vacation if such benefits are provided within the collective bargaining agreement between Livingston County and the New York State Nurses Association.
- c. Only vacation accrued on and after the employee's first anniversary of his/her date of hire may be payable upon termination of employment. Accrued vacation will not be payable upon termination of employment unless the requirements set forth in Article 18, §4 of the CSEA full-time employee collective bargaining agreement are met. "Notice of termination" as used in Article 18, §4 subparagraph d shall mean when applied to Department Heads: (i) notice of disciplinary charges for those with Civil Service Law §75 or similar due process rights, or (ii) actual notice of termination for all others. The County Administrator may for good cause shown waive some or all of the requirements for payment of vacation upon a department head's termination of employment.

4. Health Insurance.

- a. **Eligibility**. Full-time, permanent Department Heads set forth in the Department Head list shall be entitled to health insurance on the first day of the month following appointment.
- b. **Plan Options**. Eligible Department Heads hired prior to January 1, 2014 shall have the following health insurance options: the Livingston County Premium Plan and the Livingston County Standard Plan or substantially equivalent coverage. If such a Department Head does not have the Premium plan or leaves the Premium Plan, that Department Head shall no longer be eligible for enrollment in the Premium Plan. Eligible Department Heads hired on or after January 1, 2014 shall have the following health insurance options: the Livingston County Standard Plan or substantially equivalent coverage.

c. Employee Contributions Toward Cost of Coverage.

- i. <u>Date of hire before June 1, 2003</u>. Department Heads hired prior to June 1, 2003 shall not contribute to the cost of their health insurance coverage.
- ii. <u>Date of hire on or after June 1, 2003 but before January 1, 2011</u>. Department Heads hired on or after June 1, 2003 but before January 1, 2011, shall contribute 25% of the cost of their health insurance coverage if in the Premium Plan, or 15% of the cost of their health insurance coverage if in the Standard Plan.
- iii. <u>Date of hire on or after January 1, 2011 but before January 1, 2014</u>. Department Heads hired on or after January 1, 2011 but before January 1, 2014 shall contribute 30% of the cost of their health insurance coverage for the first ten years of continuous employment as a full-time employee. Thereafter, they shall contribute 25% of the cost of their health insurance coverage. If, however, the employee was hired prior to September 11, 2013 and is enrolled in the Standard Plan, the employee shall contribute 15% of the cost of his/her health insurance coverage.

iv. <u>Date of hire on or after January 1, 2014</u>. Department Heads hired on or after January 1, 2014 shall contribute 30% of the cost of their health insurance coverage.

d. Health Insurance Drop Payments.

- i. <u>Eligibility</u>. Department Heads who drop or who forego County health insurance coverage shall be entitled to a "drop payment" after they have been without County health insurance for at least one year. New Department Heads who are eligible for health insurance benefits and forego such benefits are eligible for a prorated drop payment in their first year as a Department Head.
- ii. <u>Procedure to obtain benefit</u>. In order to receive a drop payment, a Department Head must submit a written request for the payment and provide an affidavit to the Personnel Office proving that he/she has health insurance coverage through another source. Such written request and affidavit must be provided between March 15 and April 15 of the year in which payment is requested.
 - iii. Date of payment. Drop payments will be made in the first pay period of June each year.
- iv. <u>Amount of payment</u>. The amount of the drop payment will be based upon the level of coverage (e.g. two person, family, etc.) the employee would have received. Payment amounts for those employees who went without coverage for a full year (June 1 through May 31) are as follows:
- (a) <u>Dropped individual coverage: \$1,800;</u>
- (b) Dropped two person or family no spouse coverage: \$2,700; or
- (c) Dropped family coverage: \$3,600.

e. Retiree Health Insurance.

- i. <u>Eligibility</u>. Full-time Department Heads hired before November 8, 2006, who are eligible for and receive County health insurance benefits immediately preceding retirement shall be eligible for retiree health insurance benefits if they meet the eligibility criteria set forth in the CSEA full-time employee unit contract unless they have waived their right to this benefit in order to participate in the deferred compensation matching plan. Eligible employees who elect this benefit shall be responsible to pay the same percentage of the cost of such insurance that they paid as active employees. Full-time Department Heads hired on or after November 8, 2006 are not eligible for retiree health insurance benefits paid in whole or in part by the County, but may purchase such insurance through the County if they participated in the deferred compensation matching plan immediately preceding retirement.
- ii. <u>Alternate health insurance coverage</u>. If any former Department Head receiving retiree health insurance benefits paid in whole or in part by the County establishes permanent residency outside of the County's health insurance plan(s) service area, he/she may purchase alternative health insurance and the County will reimburse the retiree for the cost of such alternative coverage up to the County's share of the cost of coverage provided by the County immediately preceding the change in coverage.
- f. **Health Insurance for Dependents Following Death of Department Head**. In the event that a Department Head dies in service, health insurance benefits for covered family members will be continued on the same basis as provided to employees covered by the collective bargaining agreement between Livingston County and the Civil Service Employees Association Full-Time Unit.

5. **Deferred compensation**.

- a. **Deferred compensation plan**. Full-time, permanent Department Heads and part-time members of the Board of Supervisors shall be eligible to participate in the County's deferred compensation plan on the same basis as provided to employees covered by the collective bargaining agreement between Livingston County and the Civil Service Employees Association Full-Time Unit.
- b. **Deferred compensation matching plan**. Full-time, permanent Department Heads shall be eligible to participate in the County's deferred compensation matching plan on the same basis as provided to employees covered by the collective bargaining agreement between Livingston County and the Civil Service Employees Association Full-Time Unit..
- 6. **Flexible Spending Account**. Full-time, permanent Department Heads shall be eligible to participate in the County's flexible spending account on the same basis as provided to to employees covered by the collective bargaining agreement between Livingston County and the Civil Service Employees Association Full-Time Unit.. Be it further

RESOLVED, that employee health insurance benefits for Department Heads classified by the County as part-time, seasonal and temporary shall be provided as follows:

1. **Health Insurance**.

a. Eligibility.

- i. Salaried part-time, permanent Department Heads set forth in the Department Head list, other than Board of Supervisors members, shall be entitled to health insurance coverage. Newly hired employees will be eligible for coverage as follows: (1) if hired on the 1st through the 3rd of the month, after working through the following calendar month, or (2) if hired on the 4th through the end of the month, after working through the following two calendar months. Thereafter, such employees may enroll in coverage during an open enrollment period or within 30 days of a qualifying event. Employees who wish to enroll in coverage much submit a completed enrollment form and any other required documentation at least one month prior to the start of coverage.
- ii. Other part-time, seasonal and temporary Department Heads will be offered health insurance coverage as required by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act ("ACA") for "full-time" employees as defined by the ACA. Employees who wish to participate must enroll by the deadline provided by the County in its offers of coverage. Enrollment will require the submission of a completed enrollment form and any other required documentation.
- b. **Plan Options**. Employees eligible for coverage under this section may participate in the Livingston County Standard Plan or substantially equivalent coverage.
- c. **Employee Contributions Toward Cost of Coverage**. Employees eligible for coverage under this section who enroll will be responsible for paying 100% of the premium cost. Deductions for premiums will be made from the employee's pay. If the employee's pay is insufficient to cover the premiums, the employee must make arrangements with the County Treasurer's Office to pay the premiums directly. Failure to pay premiums as required will result in cancellation of coverage.

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this Board shall forward certified copies of this resolution and the salary schedule attached to each County Official and Head of a Department, and, be it, further

RESOLVED, that effective January 1, 2022, the portion and parts of all previous resolutions and acts of this Board, which are in conflict with the provisions of this resolution shall be rescinded and annulled.
