After presentation by Joshua J. Tonra, Assistant District Attorney, the following cases were handled in the Livingston County Court before the Honorable Robert B. Wiggins on October 10, 2017.

WILLIAME E. BUFFUM, age 51, formerly of Livingston Correctional Facility pled guilty to Attempted Promoting Prison Contraband in the First Degree (E Felony) and the matter was adjourned to January 2, 2018 for sentencing.

ROBERT L. FLYNN, age 48 of Victor was sentenced on a conviction of Driving While Intoxicated (D Felony) to 2 to 6 years in state prison. He was also ordered to pay a \$520 surcharge and a \$50 DNA fee. His license was revoked with a requirement to install an Ignition Interlock Device.

JUSTIN T. IKELER, age 33, of Dansville was sentenced on a conviction of Attempted Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the Third Degree (E Felony) to 1 ½ to 3 years in state prison as a second felony offender. He was also ordered to pay a \$325 surcharge and a \$50 DNA fee. An Order of Protection was issued for the victim.

ANNIE L. MALARA, age 30, of Elmira was sentenced on a conviction of Welfare Fraud in the Third Degree (D Felony) to 5 years probation to include 256 hours community service. She was also ordered to pay a \$325 surcharge, a \$50 DNA fee, and restitution.

CHARLES PHELPS, age 25, formerly of Livingston Correctional Facility was sentenced on a conviction of Attempted Promoting Prison Contraband in the First Degree (E Felony) to 1 ½ to 3 years in state prison as a second felony offender. He was also ordered to pay a \$325 penalty assessment and a \$50 DNA fee.

NICHOLAS P. SADWICK, age 31, of Rochester was charged with Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle in the First Degree (E Felony), Driving with .08 of One Percent or More of Alcohol in His Blood (D Felony), Driving While Intoxicated (D Felony), and Insufficient Tail Lights. He was arraigned with his attorney, pled not guilty, and the matter was adjourned to January 2, 2018.

ERIN M. STUBENRAUCH, age 25, of Wayland was sentenced on a conviction of Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated with a Child (E Felony) to 4 months intermittent incarceration and 5 years probation. She was also ordered to pay a \$2,000 fine, a \$520 surcharge and a \$50 DNA fee. Her license was revoked with a requirement to install an Ignition Interlock Device.

A YOUTHFUL OFFENDER appeared on a violation of probation and the matter was adjourned to October 17, 2017. He was remanded to the Livingston County Jail without bail.
