After presentation by Gregory J. McCaffrey, District Attorney, the following cases were handled in the Livingston County Court before the Honorable Dennis S. Cohen on January 11, 2018.

DAWN ALLWOOD BOOP, age 51, of Caledonia, convicted of Welfare Fraud in the Fifth Degree (Misdemeanor), appeared with her attorney and the matter was adjourned to February 15, 2018.

SEBASTIAN R. ARMELI, age 21, of Wayland was sentenced on a conviction of Vehicular Assault in the Second Degree (E Felony) and Driving While Ability Impaired by Combined Influence of Drugs and Alcohol (Misdemeanor) to 6 months incarceration and 5 years probation to include electronic home monitoring. He was also ordered to pay a \$325 surcharge and a \$50 DNA fee. His license was revoked with a requirement to install an Ignition Interlock Device.

CARLOS H. ARMENTA, age 37, of Bath, charged with Promoting Prison Contraband in the First Degree (D Felony), Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Fourth Degree (C Felony), and Conspiracy in the Fourth Degree (E Felony), appeared with his attorney and the matter was adjourned to January 18, 2018.

JAHMAR T. BATTISTE, age 28, of Troy pled guilty to Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Seventh Degree (Misdemeanor) and the matter was adjourned to April 12, 2018 for sentencing.

SCOTT A. CASTLE, age 36, of Manchester was charged with Attempted Rape in the First Degree (C Felony), Attempted Criminal Sexual Act in the First Degree (C Felony), and Attempted Disseminating Indecent Material to Minors in the First Degree (E Felony). He was arraigned with his attorney, pled not guilty, and the matter was adjourned to April 12, 2018.

DURUNE L. HILL, age 39, of Rochester, charged with Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle in the First Degree (E Felony), appeared with his attorney and the matter was adjourned to April 5, 2018.

ELBERT JACKSON, JR., age 55, of Rochester was sentenced on a conviction of Aggravated Driving with .18 of One Percent or More of Alcohol in His Blood (Misdemeanor) to 3 months intermittent incarceration and 3 years probation. He was also ordered to pay a \$1,000 fine, a \$325 surcharge, and a \$50 DNA fee. His license was revoked with a requirement to install an Ignition Interlock Device.

JOSEPH JEFFORDS, age 25, of Dalton was charged with Burglary in the Third Degree (D Felony), Petit Larceny (Misdemeanor), and Criminal Mischief in the Fourth Degree (Misdemeanor). He was arraigned with his attorney, pled not guilty, and the matter was adjourned to March 29, 2018.

FORREST R. MCHENRY, age 44, of Rochester, charged with Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle in the First Degree (E Felony), Uninspected Motor Vehicle, and Inadequate Splash Guards, appeared with his attorney and the matter was adjourned to April 5, 2018.

BRIAN T. MUELLER, age 24, of Penfield was sentenced on a conviction of Driving While Intoxicated (E Felony) to 4 months intermittent incarceration and 5 years probation to include electronic home monitoring. He was also ordered to pay a \$520 surcharge and a \$50 DNA fee. His license was revoked with a requirement to install an Ignition Interlock Device.

AYKUT M. OZKAYNAK, age 37, of Gates was sentenced after a jury convicted him of Murder in the Second Degree (A-1 Felony) and Tampering with Physical Evidence (E Felony) to 25 years to life in state prison. He was also ordered to pay a \$325 surcharge and a \$50 DNA fee.

DEVON O. RICHARDSON, age 39, of Rochester pled guilty to Driving with .08 of One Percent or More of Alcohol in His Blood (E Felony) and the matter was adjourned to March 8, 2018 for sentencing.

JEFFREY J. WALKER, JR., age 21, of Livonia was sentenced on a conviction of Criminal Disposal of a Weapon (D Felony) to 6 months incarceration and 5 years probation. He was also ordered to pay a \$325 surcharge, a \$50 DNA fee, and restitution. An Order of Protection was issued for the victim.
