After presentation by Victor D. Rowcliffe, First Assistant District Attorney, the following cases were handled in the Livingston County Court before the Honorable Dennis S. Cohen on January 18, 2018.

CARLOS H. ARMENTA, age 37, of Bath pled guilty to Attempted Promoting Prison Contraband in the First Degree (E Felony) and the matter was adjourned to March 29, 2018 for sentencing.

TRACY M. BABCOCK, age 45, of Rochester pled guilty to Criminal Possession Forged Instrument in the Second Degree (D Felony) and the matter was adjourned to March 29, 2018 for sentencing. She was remanded to the Livingston County Jail without bail.

LOGAN J. BRITTON, age 26, of Hemlock was charged with Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Fifth Degree (D Felony) and Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle in the Third Degree (Misdemeanor). He was arraigned with his attorney, pled not guilty, and the matter was adjourned to February 15, 2018.

MARLIN L. CASH, age 39, of Rochester pled guilty to Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle in the First Degree (E Felony) and a violation of probation and the matter was adjourned to March 29, 2018 for sentencing. He was remanded to the Livingston County Jail without bail.

CAMERON J. VELAZQUEZ, age 25, of Mt. Morris pled guilty to Burglary in the Third Degree (D Felony) and the matter was adjourned to April 5, 2018 for sentencing.

WILSON, age 35, of Lakeville was sentenced on a conviction of Attempted Promoting a Sexual Performance by a Child (E Felony) to 3 months in the Livingston County Jail and 10 years probation to include Sex Offender Registration. She was also ordered to pay a \$325 surcharge, a \$50 DNA fee, and a \$1000 Sex Offender Registry Fee. An Order of Protection was issued for the victim.
