DA NEWSLETTER ~ DECEMBER 20, 2018

After presentation by Justin M. Hill, Assistant District Attorney, the following cases were handled in the Livingston County Court before the Honorable Dennis S. Cohen on December 20, 2018.

LUIS O. COLLAZO-NEGRON, age 28, of Rochester, charged with Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle in the First Degree (E Felony) and Speeding, appeared with his attorney and the matter was adjourned to January 17, 2019.

TYLER M. DAY, age 24, of Avon was sentenced on a conviction of Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated (E Felony) to 16 weekends in the Livingston County Jail and five years probation to include electronic home monitoring. He was also ordered to pay a \$520 surcharge, a \$50 DNA fee, and his license was revoked with a requirement to install an Ignition Interlock Device.

MICHAEL A. ELY, age 23, of Palmyra was sentenced on a conviction of Grand Larceny in the Fourth Degree (E Felony) to 12 weekends in the Livingston County Jail and five years probation. He was also ordered to pay a \$325 surcharge and a \$50 DNA fee.

BENJAMIN B. GRESSINGER, age 25, of Perry, charged with 2 counts of Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the Third Degree (D Felony), Prohibited Use and Possession of a Firearm, and Failure to Stop Sign at a Stop Sign, appeared with his attorney and the matter was adjourned to January 31, 2019.

GARY W. HADFIELD, age 33, of West Bloomfield was sentenced on a conviction of Driving While Intoxicated (E Felony) to 12 weekends in the Livingston County Jail and five years probation to include electronic home monitoring. He was also ordered to pay a \$520 surcharge, a \$50 DNA fee, and his license was revoked with a requirement to install an Ignition Interlock Device.

JAMES M. HARPOLE, age 58, of Conesus was sentenced on a conviction of Driving While Intoxicated (E Felony) to 16 weekends in the Livingston County Jail and five years probation to include electronic home monitoring. He was also ordered to pay a \$520 surcharge, a \$50 DNA fee, and his license was revoked with a requirement to install an Ignition Interlock Device.

ERNEST C. HUTTON, age 48, of Leroy was sentenced on a conviction of Attempted Grand Larceny in the Third Degree (E Felony) to 1 ½ to 3 years in state prison as a second felony offender. He was also ordered to pay a \$325 penalty assessment and a \$50 DNA fee.

AKEEM L. ROBINSON, age 30, of Rochester, charged with Criminal Possession Controlled Substance in the Third Degree (B Felony), Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Fifth Degree (D Felony), Criminal Use of Drug Paraphernalia in the Second Degree (Misdemeanor), Criminal Impersonation in the Second Degree (Misdemeanor), Insufficient Tail Lamps, and two counts of Assault in the Second Degree (D Felony), appeared with his attorney and the matter was adjourned to January 24, 2019.

CARRIE A. YOUNG, age 43, of Stanley was sentenced on a conviction of Driving While Intoxicated (D Felony) and a violation of probation to 6 months in the Livingston County Jail and five years probation to include Drug Treatment Court. She was also ordered to pay a \$520 surcharge, a \$50 DNA fee, and her license was revoked with a requirement to install an Ignition Interlock Device.
