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Livingston County Declares Local State of Emergency and Opens Emergency Operations Center in Response to COVID-19 Crisis

Geneseo, NY, March 16, 2020 — On Saturday, March 14, 2020, a local State of Emergency was declared by David LeFeber, Chairman of the Livingston County Board of Supervisors. The State of Emergency allows local officials to mobilize quickly and activate all necessary resources to respond to the COVID-19 crisis as it evolves.

The County activated its Emergency Operations Center (EOC) on March 16, 2020 in order to centralize its COVID-19 efforts.

What is an EOC?

Livingston County Administrator Ian M. Coyle stated, “The EOC serves as a command center and coordination hub for county officials and support agencies during this public health crisis. It provides our multi-disciplinary team a safe location equipped with effective technology necessary to collect and share information, track resources, coordinate plans, and communicate with staff and the public.”
