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
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COVID-19 Cases Continue Downward Trend but Residents Should Remain Vigilant

Geneseo, NY, February 11, 2021 — According to New York State, COVID-19 case numbers continue on a downward trend in the Finger Lakes Region. For example, the seven-day rolling average of new positive cases was 5.24% on January 24, 2021 and 2.99% on February 7, 2021. The following graph shows the 90-day trend of new positive cases for the Finger Lakes Region.
