Reaching the Most Vulnerable Residents

Livingston County Continues to Vaccinate Community Members

Geneseo, NY, April 26, 2021 — The Livingston County Department of Health continues to vaccinate New Yorkers who are 18 years of age and older using the Moderna vaccine.

“While more than 35% of Livingston County residents have already been vaccinated, the Livingston County Department of Health continues to strive to make the vaccination process easy for our residents, including those who are most vulnerable to issues related to COVID-19,” stated Jennifer Rodriguez, Livingston County’s Public Health Director.

Where do the most vulnerable populations in Livingston County live? According to the COVID-19 Community Vulnerability Index, Piffard, Sparta, Mount Morris and Hunt are communities that may need more support regarding the health, economic and social effects of COVID-19. The index tool assesses which US communities may be less resilient to the impacts of the COVID pandemic. It looks at indicators of social vulnerability, such as socioeconomic status or language barriers, with indicators of vulnerability unique to the COVID-19 pandemic, such as access to healthcare and comorbidities among the population. 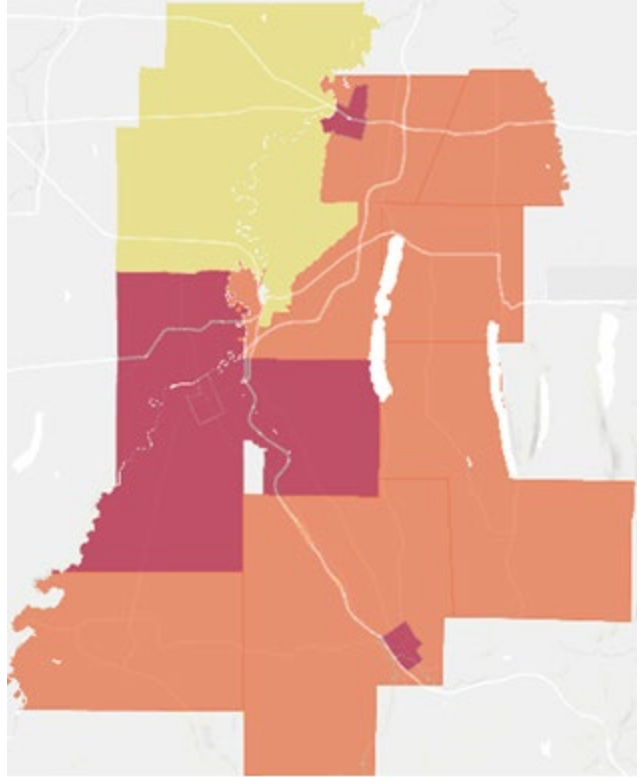


Image: Livingston County, New York according to the COVID-19 Community Vulnerability Index
