Teaching Youth About Preparedness

Geneseo, N.Y., September 23, 2021 – September is National Preparedness Month. The theme this year is “Disasters Don’t Wait, Make Your Plan Today”. As our nation continues to respond to COVID-19, there is no better time to be involved this September. As part of the National Preparedness Month, this week the Livingston County Department of Health and the Office of Emergency Management will share information to help you “Teach Youth About Preparedness”.

Emergency managers, teachers, and others who work with children understand that youth are an important part of our communities and can be vulnerable during disasters. It’s important to keep youth safe and to include their needs in planning, response, and recovery efforts. This also includes knowing how you will reestablish your facilities and services if impacted by disaster.

Disasters happen everywhere. Every member of the family can prepare. Young children and teens can be a part of the process. As a parent, guardian, or other family member, you have an important role when it comes to protecting the children in your life and helping them to be prepared in case disaster strikes.

Children and youth also have unique abilities to prepare themselves. Children and youth can be empowered through understanding risks and knowing how to protect themselves. Empowered youth can help involve their families, peers, and communities in disaster preparedness. Talk to your kids about preparing for emergencies and what to do in case you are separated. Reassure them by providing information about how they can get involved.
